

1 amount paid by the claimants (collectively, the “Claimants” and each a “Claimant”)² to the Debtor.
2 Each of the Claimants appears to be a member or former member of the Debtor (and not a creditor)
3 who is asserting a Claim or Claims against the estate based either on nothing or based on account of
4 member benefits or member rewards. Each Claimant apparently purchased or was given
5 memberships to the Debtor and subsequently purchased or was given membership rewards. These
6 rewards have no value outside of the Debtor’s business. While the Debtor believes that most, if not
7 all, of the Claimants received services from the Debtor at least equal to what was paid, the Debtor
8 does not object to the Claimants retaining a claim in this case for the amount each Claimant actually
9 paid. By this Omnibus Objection, the Debtor seeks to (i) disallow certain claims in their entirety and
10 (ii) reduce the amount of certain of the Claims to the amount reflected on the Debtor’s books and
11 records as to what was actually paid by the Claimants to the Debtor for their respective memberships
12 and membership rewards. Accordingly, the Debtor objects to the Claims and respectfully requests
13 entry of an order substantially in the form attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** reducing certain Claims and
14 disallowing certain Claims pursuant to section 502(b) and Bankruptcy Rules 3003 and 3007.

15 **CLAIMANTS RECEIVING THIS OMNIBUS OBJECTION SHOULD LOCATE**
16 **THEIR NAMES AND CLAIMS ON PAGES 5-6, 9-10, AND 12-13 OF THIS OMNIBUS**
17 **OBJECTION.**

18 This Omnibus Objection is made and based upon the following Memorandum of Points and
19 Authorities, the declaration of Ignatius Piazza (the “Piazza Decl.”) filed in support of the Omnibus
20 Objection, the papers, pleadings, and other documents on file with the clerk of the Court, and
21 judicial notice of which is respectfully requested pursuant to Federal Rule of Evidence 201, and such
22 other and further evidence as may be provided at the hearing on the Omnibus Objection.

23 **MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES**

24 **I. JURISDICTION AND VENUE**

25 1. This Court has jurisdiction to consider this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and
26 1334 and Local Rule 1001(b)(1).

1 2. Venue is proper before this Court pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409.

2 3. This is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2).

3 4. The statutory predicates for the relief sought herein are Section 11 U.S.C. §§ 105 and
4 502, Bankruptcy Rule 3007, and Local Rule 3007.

5 5. As required by Local Rule 9014.2, the Debtor consents to the entry of final orders or
6 judgments by this Court if it is determined that this Court, absent consent of the parties, cannot enter
7 final orders or judgments consistent with Article III of the United States Constitution.

8 **II. STATEMENT OF FACTS**

9 **A. General Case Background**

10 6. On May 24, 2022, the Debtor filed a voluntary petition for relief under chapter 11 of
11 the Bankruptcy Code. The Debtor continues to operate its business and manage its financial affairs
12 as a debtor in possession pursuant to sections 1107(a) and 1108 of the Bankruptcy Code. No trustee
13 or examiner has been appointed in this case.

14 7. On June 9, 2022, United States Trustee for Region 17 filed its *Amended Appointment*
15 *of the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors* [ECF No. 116].

16 **B. General History of the Debtor**

17 8. The Debtor was founded in 1996 by Ignatius Piazza. Dr. Piazza owns, either directly
18 or indirectly, 100% of the Debtor. The Debtor was originally formed as a California business and
19 operated near Bakersfield, California, from its formation in 1996 until 2002. In 1998, the Debtor
20 purchased 550 acres of raw land 45 minutes from Las Vegas, acquired approximately 500 acre feet
21 of water rights and began building what is now the finest and largest private firearms training facility
22 in the world (the “Front Sight Property”).

23 9. In 2012, the Debtor became a Nevada limited liability company. The Debtor’s
24 primary place of business is the Front Sight Property located at 1 Front Sight Road, Pahrump,
25 Nevada 89061, Nye County Assessor’s Parcel Nos. 045-481-05 and 045-481-06.

26 10. The Front Sight Property is accessed by a four-mile, two lane paved road, and is
27 currently comprised of 50 outdoor firearms training ranges, live fire tactical training simulators, an
28 8,000 square foot classroom and pro shop, and assorted accessory buildings, bathrooms, three water

1 wells and thousands of square yards of completed grading for future development (the “Front Sight
2 Property Facility”).

3 11. The Debtor provides firearms training courses which promote the defensive use of
4 various firearms. Courses are offered to the general public, members of law enforcement and
5 military members.

6 12. The Front Sight Firearms Facility is the most successful firearms training facility of
7 its type in the United States. The Debtor provides classes and instruction annually to upward of
8 40,000 gun and weapons enthusiasts. The Debtor is considered the leader in its field, and provides
9 additional training and instruction for numerous city and state agencies seeking to improve
10 performance of their respective law enforcement departments.

11 13. Over the last 25 years, the Debtor has trained a million students and as of the Petition
12 Date, the Debtor had over 261,000 members.

13 14. Historically, the Debtor operated its business by selling “lifetime” memberships and
14 promotional benefits such as “Front Sight Bucks,” TBD memberships, and certificates to use for
15 training courses, plus the Debtor sells ancillary products. Pre-petition, to take its business “to the
16 next level,” the Debtor developed a major expansion plan that contemplated the construction of a
17 vacation and resort development to be known as the “Front Sight Vacation Club & Resort,” to
18 include vacation residences, an RV park and related facilities, a retail area, and a pavilion. The
19 Debtor envisioned creating a self-fulfilling ecosystem, involving memberships and promotional
20 benefits, that would lead to an incentivized customer base that would take advantage of the club and
21 resort and other offerings to redound to the Debtor’s benefit.

22 15. Ultimately, due to facts not relevant to this Omnibus Objection, the Debtor was
23 unable to expand its business, was facing a wrongful foreclosure of the Front Sight Property, and
24 sought protection under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code to restructure its business.

25 **III. RELIEF REQUESTED**

26 16. The Debtor has reviewed the proofs of claim filed in this case and has determined that
27 the following Claims are subject to reduction and/or disallowance because the amount of each of the
28

1 Claims far exceeds the amount the Claimants paid to the Debtor for their respective membership(s)
 2 and membership rewards:

17. Each of the Claimants appears to be a member or former member of the Debtor who is asserting a Claim or Claims against the estate based either on nothing or based on account of member benefits or member rewards. Each Claimant apparently purchased or was given

1 memberships to the Debtor and subsequently purchased or was given membership rewards. These
2 rewards have no value outside of the Debtor's business. While the Debtor believes that most, if not
3 all, of the Claimants received services from the Debtor at least equal to what was paid, the Debtor
4 does not object to the Claimants retaining a claim in this case for the amount each Claimant actually
5 paid for their respective memberships and membership rewards.

6 18. The Debtor seeks entry of an order, pursuant to section 502 of the Bankruptcy Code
7 and Bankruptcy Rule 3007, (i) disallowing certain claims in their entirety and (ii) reducing the
8 amount of certain of the Claims to the amount reflected on the Debtor's books and records as to what
9 was actually paid by the Claimants to the Debtor for their respective memberships and membership
10 rewards, for the reasons set forth below.

11 **IV. BASIS FOR RELIEF**

12 19. Bankruptcy Rule 3001(f) provides that a "proof of claim executed and filed in
13 accordance with these rules shall constitute prima facie evidence of the validity and amount of the
14 claim." It is well established in the Ninth Circuit that the initial burden of persuasion for
15 establishing the validity and amount of a proof of claim is upon the claimant. *Ashford v.*
16 *Consolidated Pioneer Mortgage (In re Consolidated Pioneer Mortgage)*, 178 B.R. 222 (9th Cir.
17 BAP 1995), *aff'd*, 91 F.3d 151 (9th Cir. 1996) (a proof of claim must have a writing attached and
18 include supporting documentation to qualify for presumptive validity). However, the prima facie
19 validity of a claim does not attach unless the claim sets forth the facts necessary to support the claim.
20 *Id.* at 226.

21 20. Bankruptcy Code section 502 authorizes a "party in interest," such as the Debtor, to
22 object to claims. 11 U.S.C. § 502(a). Once the objector raises "facts tending to defeat the claim by
23 probative force equal to that of the allegations of the proofs of claim themselves," then the burden
24 reverts to the claimant to prove the validity of the claim by a preponderance of evidence. *Wright v.*
25 *Holm (In re Holm)*, 931 F.2d 620, 623 (9th Cir. 1991); *In re Consolidated Pioneer Mortgage*, 178
26 B.R. at 226. Indeed, the ultimate burden of persuasion is always on the claimant. *In re Holm*, 931
27 F.2d at 623; *see also In re Heath*, 331 B.R. 424 (9th Cir. BAP 2005) (explaining that a claim that
28

1 fails to attach supporting documentation is not entitled to be considered as prima facie evidence of
2 validity and amount of claim).

3 21. “If the creditor does not provide information or is unable to support its claim, then
4 that in itself may raise an evidentiary basis to object to the unsupported aspects of the claim, or even
5 a basis for evidentiary sanctions, thereby coming within Section 502(b)’s grounds to disallow the
6 claim.” *In re Heath*, 331 B.R. 424, 437 (B.A.P. 9th Cir. 2005).

7 22. Section 502(b)(1) requires disallowance of a claim if “such claim is unenforceable
8 against the debtor and property of the debtor, under any agreement or applicable law for a reason
9 other than because such claim is contingent or unmatured. . .” 11 U.S.C. § 502(b)(1). The
10 “applicable law” referenced in Section 502(b)(1) includes bankruptcy law as well as other federal
11 and state laws. *See Cavaliere v. Sapir*, 208 B.R. 784, 786-787 (D. Conn. 1997) (providing that
12 “applicable law” includes bankruptcy law). A debtor is therefore allowed to raise any federal or
13 state law defenses to a claim. *See In re G.I. Industries, Inc.*, 204 F.3d 1276, 1281 (9th Cir. 2000)
14 (stating that a claim cannot be allowed under Section 502(b)(1) if it is unenforceable under
15 nonbankruptcy law); *Johnson v. Righetti*, 756 F.2d 738, 741 (9th Cir. 1985) (finding that the validity
16 of the claim may be determined under state law); *In re Eastview Estates II*, 713 F.2d 443, 447 (9th
17 Cir. 1983) (applying California law).

18 **V. OBJECTIONS TO CLAIMS**

19 23. First, the Claims are not entitled to prima facie validity because each Claim does not
20 contain sufficient evidence to support the amount of the Claim. The Claims are essentially “face
21 page” proofs of claim that do not set forth the facts necessary to support the amount of the Claims.
22 Indeed, none of the Claims include an accounting of the amounts paid by Claimants to the Debtor for
23 their memberships and membership rewards. The burden of persuasion for establishing the validity
24 and amount of a Claim is on the Claimant, and the Claimants have failed to meet his burden.
25 Consequently, the Court should sustain the Omnibus Objection.

26 24. Second, the Claims should be reduced to the amount that the respective Claimant paid
27 to the Debtor for their membership and membership rewards. Specifically, the Debtor’s books and
28

1 records show that the Claimants paid the following amounts to the Debtor for their membership and
 2 membership rewards:

25. Accordingly, the Debtor objects to the Claims because the Claims far exceed the amount the Claimants paid to the Debtor and requests that the Court reduce the Claims to the amount each Claimant paid to the Debtor for their membership and membership rewards.

1 26. Third, Claim Nos. 294-1 and 480-1 state that \$3,350 of the Claim is entitled to
2 priority status under Section 507(a)(7). However, deposits for memberships are not entitled to
3 priority status under Section 507(a)(7). *In re Palmas del Mar Country Club, Inc.*, 443 B.R. 569, 575
4 (Bankr. D.P.R. 2010) (disallowing priority claims filed by the country club's members for refund of
5 the membership deposit and allowing the claims as general unsecured claims). Accordingly, the
6 Debtor specifically objects to the priority of Claim Nos. 294-1 and 480-1. Claim No. 294-1 should
7 be reduced to \$3,439.00 (the amount reflected in the Debtor's books and records) and be allowed as
8 a general unsecured claim. Claim No. 480-1 should be reduced to \$299.00 (the amount reflected in
9 the Debtor's books and records) and be allowed as a general unsecured claim.

10 27. Fourth, the Debtor's books and records reflect that the following Claimants were
11 refunded after their memberships were terminated, i.e., the Debtor refunded the Claimants the total
12 amount of money that the Claimants paid the Debtor for their memberships and membership
13 benefits:

- 14 a. Edgar R. Bolanos, Claim No. 6-2, refunded \$659.00,
- 15 b. Gary Short, Claim No. 31-1, refunded \$451.00,
- 16 c. Judson Miers, Claim No. 47-1, refunded \$2,162.00, and
- 17 d. Bruce Logie, Claim No. 169-1, \$1,294.00.

18 28. Accordingly, Mr. Bolanos, Mr. Short, Mr. Miers, and Mr. Logie are not entitled to
19 any claim against the Debtor or its estate and Claim Nos. 6-2, 31-1, 47-1, and 169-1 should be
20 disallowed in their entirety.

21 29. Fifth, the Debtor's books and records do not reflect that the following Claimants paid
22 any amounts to Debtor for their membership or member benefits:

- 23 a. Sam Linville, Claim No. 74-1,
- 24 b. Nathaniel Short, Claim No. 88-1,
- 25 c. Eli Short, Claim No. 90-1, and
- 26 d. Katy Phillips, Claim No. 522-1.

27 30. Accordingly, the Debtor requests that Claim Nos. 74-1, 88-1, 90-1, and 522-1 be
28 disallowed in their entirety.

1 31. Sixth, it appears that Claimant Gary Short has filed two additional proofs of claim,
2 Claim Nos. 78-1 and 154-1, that are duplicative of Claim No. 31-1. It also appears that Claimant
3 Charles Phillips has filed Claim No. 521-1, which appears to be duplicative of Claim No. 520-1.
4 Accordingly, the Debtor respectfully requests that Claim Nos. 78-1, 154-1, and 521-1 be disallowed
5 in their entirety because they are duplicative of other Claims.

6 32. Accordingly, the Debtor respectfully requests that the Court reduce the following
7 Claims and allow the Claims as general unsecured claims as set forth below:

34. The Debtor specifically reserves the right to amend this Omnibus Objection, file additional papers in support of this Omnibus Objection or take other appropriate actions, including, *inter alia*, to: (a) respond to any allegation or defense that may be raised in a response filed by or on behalf of any of the Claimants or other interested parties; (b) object further to any Claim for which a Claimant provides (or attempts to provide) additional documentation or substantiation; and (c) object

1 further to any of the Claims addressed herein based on additional information that may be
2 discovered upon further review by the Debtor or through discovery pursuant to the Bankruptcy
3 Rules.

4 **VII. SEPARATE CONTESTED MATTERS**

5 35. Each of the Claims and the Debtor’s objections thereto constitute a separate contested
6 matter as contemplated by Bankruptcy Rules 3007 and 9014 and Local Rule 3007. The Debtor
7 requests that any order entered by the Court with respect to a particular Claim objected to in this
8 Omnibus Objection be deemed a separate order with respect to each Claim in accordance with
9 Bankruptcy Rule 3007(1).

10 **VIII. NOTICE**

11 36. The Debtor will serve copies of this Omnibus Objection upon each of the Claimants
12 identified in the chart contained herein at the addresses listed on the disputed Claims, as filed.

13 **IX. CONCLUSION**

14 The Debtor respectfully request that the Court enter an order, substantially in the form
15 attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** reducing certain claims and disallowing other Claims (and expunging
16 them from the Court’s docket), and granting such other and further relief as the Court may deem
17 proper and just under the circumstances.

**ORDER SUSTAINING DEBTOR’S SECOND OMNIBUS OBJECTION AND (1)

3 herein (the “Debtor”). Appearances were as duly noted on the record at the hearing.

4 The Court, having read and considered the Omnibus Objection and all evidence filed in

7 including, without limitation, the record in this case as reflected on the docket; the Court having set
