	Front Sight Management LLC, the chapter 11 debtor herein (the "Debtor"), hereby submits				
	its fifth omnibus objection ("Omnibus O	bjection") pursuant to Section ¹ 502 and Bankruptcy Rule			
	3007, to the proofs of claim identified he	erein. The Debtor has determined that the proofs of claim			
	listed in the chart herein (collectively, the	e "Claims" and each a "Claim") are subject to reduction			
		nkruptcy Code (11 U.S.C. §§ 101 et seq.); references to

and/or disallowance because the amount of each of the Claims exceeds the amount paid by the 1 claimants (collectively, the "Claimants" and each a "Claimant")² to the Debtor. Each of the 2 Claimants appears to be a member or former member of the Debtor who is asserting a Claim or 3 Claims against the estate based either on nothing or based on account of member benefits or member 4 rewards. Each Claimant apparently purchased or was given memberships to the Debtor and 5 subsequently purchased or was given membership rewards. These rewards have no value outside of 6 the Debtor's business. While the Debtor believes that most, if not all, of the Claimants received 7 services from the Debtor at least equal to what was paid, the Debtor does not object to the Claimants 8 retaining a claim in this case for the amount each Claimant actually paid. By this Omnibus 9 Objection, the Debtor seeks to (i) disallow certain claims in their entirety and (ii) reduce the amount 10 of certain of the Claims to the amount reflected on the Debtor's books and records as to what was 11 actually paid by the Claimants to the Debtor for their respective memberships and membership 12 rewards. Accordingly, the Debtor objects to the Claims and respectfully requests entry of an order 13 substantially in the form attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** reducing certain Claims and disallowing 14 certain Claims pursuant to section 502(b) and Bankruptcy Rules 3003 and 3007. 15

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CLAIMANTS RECEIVING THIS OMNIBUS OBJECTION SHOULD LOCATE THEIR NAMES AND CLAIMS ON PAGES 5-6, 8-9, AND 11-12.

This Omnibus Objection is made and based upon the following Memorandum of Points and
Authorities, the declaration of Ignatius Piazza (the "Piazza Decl.") filed in support of the Omnibus
Objection, the papers, pleadings, and other documents on file with the clerk of the Court, and
judicial notice of which is respectfully requested pursuant to Federal Rule of Evidence 201, and such
other and further evidence as may be provided at the hearing on the Omnibus Objection.

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MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES

I. JURISDICTION AND VENUE

1. This Court has jurisdiction to consider this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and
1334 and Local Rule 1001(b)(1).

2. Venue is proper before this Court pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409.

3. This is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2).

4. The statutory predicates for the relief sought herein are Section 11 U.S.C. §§ 105 and
502, Bankruptcy Rule 3007, and Local Rule 3007.

- 5 5. As required by Local Rule 9014.2, the Debtor consents to the entry of final orders or
 6 judgments by this Court if it is determined that this Court, absent consent of the parties, cannot enter
 7 final orders or judgments consistent with Article III of the United States Constitution.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

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General Case Background

6. On May 24, 2022, the Debtor filed a voluntary petition for relief under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code. The Debtor continues to operate its business and manage its financial affairs as a debtor in possession pursuant to sections 1107(a) and 1108 of the Bankruptcy Code. No trustee or examiner has been appointed in this case.

7. On June 9, 2022, United States Trustee for Region 17 filed its *Amended Appointment* of the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors [ECF No. 116].

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General History of the Debtor

8. The Debtor was founded in 1996 by Ignatius Piazza. Dr. Piazza owns, either directly
or indirectly, 100% of the Debtor. The Debtor was originally formed as a California business and
operated near Bakersfield, California, from its formation in 1996 until 2002. In 1998, the Debtor
purchased 550 acres of raw land 45 minutes from Las Vegas, acquired approximately 500 acre feet
of water rights and began building what is now the finest and largest private firearms training facility
in the world (the "Front Sight Property").

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9. In 2012, the Debtor became a Nevada limited liability company. The Debtor's primary place of business is the Front Sight Property located at 1 Front Sight Road, Pahrump, Nevada 89061, Nye County Assessor's Parcel Nos. 045-481-05 and 045-481-06.

10. The Front Sight Property is accessed by a four-mile, two lane paved road, and is
currently comprised of 50 outdoor firearms training ranges, live fire tactical training simulators, an
8,000 square foot classroom and pro shop, and assorted accessory buildings, bathrooms, three water

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wells and thousands of square yards of completed grading for future development (the "Front Sight
 Property Facility").

11. Historically, the Debtor provided firearms training courses which promoted the
defensive use of various firearms. Courses were offered to the general public, members of law
enforcement and military members.

12. Historically, the Debtor operated its business by selling "lifetime" memberships and 6 promotional benefits such as "Front Sight Bucks," TBD memberships, and certificates to use for 7 training courses, plus the Debtor sells ancillary products. Pre-petition, to take its business "to the 8 next level," the Debtor developed a major expansion plan that contemplated the construction of a 9 vacation and resort development to be known as the "Front Sight Vacation Club & Resort," to 10 include vacation residences, an RV park and related facilities, a retail area, and a pavilion. The 11 Debtor envisioned creating a self-fulfilling ecosystem, involving memberships and promotional 12 benefits, that would lead to an incentivized customer base that would take advantage of the club and 13 resort and other offerings to redound to the Debtor's benefit. 14

13. Ultimately, due to facts not relevant to this Omnibus Objection, the Debtor was
 unable to expand its business, was facing a wrongful foreclosure of the Front Sight Property, and
 sought protection under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code to restructure its business.

18 14. On November 29, 2022, the order confirming the Debtor's second amended chapter
19 11 plan of reorganization was entered [ECF No. 556] (the "Conformation Order") pursuant to which
20 the "Reorganized Debtor" will have new ownership and membership on the "effective date" of the
21 plan. The Debtor expects the effective date to be December 1, 2022.

Pursuant to the Confirmation Order, a liquidating trust ("Trust") will be created to,
among other things, oversee and administer general unsecured claims, objections thereto, and
ultimately distributions on allowed claims. Amanda Demby of Province, LLC will be the liquidating
trustee of the Trust and will take over as the party in interest to all pending claim objections,
including this Omnibus Objection.

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III. RELIEF REQUESTED

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16. The Debtor has reviewed the proofs of claim filed in this case and has determined that
the following Claims are subject to reduction and/or disallowance because the amount of each of the
Claims exceeds the amount the Claimants paid to the Debtor for their respective membership(s) and
membership rewards:

- 17. Each of the Claimants appears to be a member or former member of the Debtor who is asserting a Claim or Claims against the estate based either on nothing or based on account of member benefits or member rewards. Each Claimant apparently purchased or was given memberships to the Debtor and subsequently purchased or was given membership rewards. These rewards have no value outside of the Debtor's business. While the Debtor believes that most, if not all, of the Claimants received services from the Debtor at least equal to what was paid, the Debtor does not object to the Claimants retaining a claim in this case for the amount each Claimant actually paid for their respective memberships and membership rewards.
- 18. The Debtor seeks entry of an order, pursuant to Section 502 and Bankruptcy Rule
 3007, (i) disallowing certain Claims in their entirety and (ii) reducing the amount of certain of the
 Claims to the amount reflected on the Debtor's books and records as to what was actually paid by
 the Claimants to the Debtor for their respective memberships and membership rewards, for the
 reasons set forth below.

I IV. BASIS FOR RELIEF

19. Bankruptcy Rule 3001(f) provides that a "proof of claim executed and filed in 2 accordance with these rules shall constitute prima facie evidence of the validity and amount of the 3 claim." It is well established in the Ninth Circuit that the initial burden of persuasion for 4 establishing the validity and amount of a proof of claim is upon the claimant. Ashford v. 5 Consolidated Pioneer Mortgage (In re Consolidated Pioneer Mortgage), 178 B.R. 222 (9th Cir. 6 BAP 1995), aff'd, 91 F.3d 151 (9th Cir. 1996) (a proof of claim must have a writing attached and 7 include supporting documentation to qualify for presumptive validity). However, the prima facie 8 validity of a claim does not attach unless the claim sets forth the facts necessary to support the claim. 9 Id. at 226. 10

20. Section 502 authorizes a "party in interest," such as the Debtor, to object to claims. 11 11 U.S.C. § 502(a). Once the objector raises "facts tending to defeat the claim by probative force 12 equal to that of the allegations of the proofs of claim themselves," then the burden reverts to the 13 claimant to prove the validity of the claim by a preponderance of evidence. Wright v. Holm (In re 14 Holm), 931 F.2d 620, 623 (9th Cir. 1991); In re Consolidated Pioneer Mortgage, 178 B.R. at 226. 15 Indeed, the ultimate burden of persuasion is always on the claimant. In re Holm, 931 F.2d at 623; 16 see also In re Heath, 331 B.R. 424 (9th Cir. BAP 2005) (explaining that a claim that fails to attach 17 supporting documentation is not entitled to be considered as prima facie evidence of validity and 18 amount of claim). 19

20 21. "If the creditor does not provide information or is unable to support its claim, then 21 that in itself may raise an evidentiary basis to object to the unsupported aspects of the claim, or even 22 a basis for evidentiary sanctions, thereby coming within Section 502(b)'s grounds to disallow the 23 claim." *In re Heath*, 331 B.R. 424, 437 (B.A.P. 9th Cir. 2005).

22. Section 502(b)(1) requires disallowance of a claim if "such claim is unenforceable 25 against the debtor and property of the debtor, under any agreement or applicable law for a reason 26 other than because such claim is contingent or unmatured. . ." 11 U.S.C. § 502(b)(1). The 27 "applicable law" referenced in Section 502(b)(1) includes bankruptcy law as well as other federal 28 and state laws. *See Cavaliere v. Sapir*, 208 B.R. 784, 786-787 (D. Conn. 1997) (providing that

"applicable law" includes bankruptcy law). A debtor is therefore allowed to raise any federal or
state law defenses to a claim. *See In re G.I. Industries, Inc.*, 204 F.3d 1276, 1281 (9th Cir. 2000)
(stating that a claim cannot be allowed under Section 502(b)(1) if it is unenforceable under
nonbankruptcy law); *Johnson v. Righetti*, 756 F.2d 738, 741 (9th Cir. 1985) (finding that the validity
of the claim may be determined under state law); *In re Eastview Estates II*, 713 F.2d 443, 447 (9th
Cir. 1983) (applying California law).

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V.

OBJECTIONS TO CLAIMS

23. First, many of the Claims are not entitled to prima facie validity because the Claims 8 do not contain sufficient evidence to support the amount of the Claim. Many of the Claims are 9 essentially "face page" proofs of claim that do not set forth the facts necessary to support the amount 10 of the Claims though some of them do have attachments.⁴ The Claims do not include a sufficient 11 accounting of the amounts paid by Claimants to the Debtor for their memberships and membership 12 rewards. The burden of persuasion for establishing the validity and amount of a Claim is on the 13 Claimant, and the Claimants have failed to meet their burden. Consequently, the Court should 14 sustain the Omnibus Objection. 15

Second, the Claims should be reduced to the amount that the respective Claimant paid
 to the Debtor for their membership and membership rewards. Specifically, the Debtor's books and
 records show that the Claimants paid the following amounts to the Debtor for their membership and
 membership rewards:

⁵ 25. Accordingly, the Debtor objects to the Claims because the Claims exceed the amount
⁶ the Claimants paid to the Debtor and requests that the Court reduce the Claims to the amount each
⁷ Claimant paid to the Debtor for their membership and membership rewards (or disallow the Claims
⁸ to the extent that the member has not paid anything to the Debtor) and to disallow any future proof
⁹ of claim filed by the Claimants based on their membership and/or membership rewards.

26. Third, Claim Nos. 283-1, 334-1, and 353-1 state that a portion of the Claim is entitled
 to priority status under Section 507(a)(7). However, deposits for memberships are not entitled to
 priority status under Section 507(a)(7). *In re Palmas del Mar Country Club, Inc.*, 443 B.R. 569, 575
 (Bankr. D.P.R. 2010) (disallowing priority claims filed by the country club's members for refund of
 the membership deposit and allowing the claims as general unsecured claims). Accordingly, to the
 extent that Claim Nos. 283-1, 334-1, and 353-1 are allowed in any amount, the claims are not
 entitled to priority and should be classified as general unsecured claims.

Fourth, the Debtor's books and records reflect that several of the Claimants did not
 pay any amounts to Debtor for their membership or member benefits. Accordingly, the Debtor
 requests that those Claims be disallowed in their entirety.

28. Fifth, it appears that Claimants Rick Grant and Luis Jaramillo have filed duplicate
 claims. Specifically, Claimant Rick Grant filed Proof of Claim No. 922-1, which is duplicative of
 Proof of Claim No. 919-1, and Luis Jaramillo filed Proof of Claim No. 924-1, which is duplicative
 of Proof of Claim No. 918-1. Accordingly, Claim Nos. 922-1 and 924-1 should be disallowed in
 their entirety.

25 29. Sixth, the Debtor's books and records reflect that the Debtor refunded \$200.00 to
 26 Claimant Francis Christopher Van Landingham (aka Frank Van Landingham) after his membership
 27 was terminated, i.e., the Debtor refunded Mr. Van Landingham the total amount of money that Mr.
 28 Van Landingham paid to the Debtor for his membership and membership benefits. Mr. Landingham

previously filed Claim No. 138-1 in the amount of \$600,000.00. The Debtor objected to Claim No.
138-1 in the *Debtor's First Omnibus Objection (1) Reducing and Allowing Certain Member Claims and (2) Disallowing and Expunging Certain Other Member Claims* [ECF No. 411] and requested
that Claim No. 138-1 be disallowed in its entirety because the Debtor previously refunded Mr.
Landingham all moneys paid to the Debtor. Accordingly, Mr. Van Landingham is not entitled to
any claim against the Debtor or its estate and Claim No. 335-1 should be disallowed in its entirety.

30. Accordingly, the Debtor respectfully requests that the Court reduce the following
Claims and allow the Claims as general unsecured claims as set forth below:

32. The Debtor specifically reserves the right to amend this Omnibus Objection, file 20 additional papers in support of this Omnibus Objection or take other appropriate actions, including, 21 inter alia, to: (a) respond to any allegation or defense that may be raised in a response filed by or on 22 behalf of any of the Claimants or other interested parties; (b) object further to any Claim for which a 23 Claimant provides (or attempts to provide) additional documentation or substantiation; and (c) object 24 further to any of the Claims addressed herein based on additional information that may be 25 discovered upon further review by the Debtor or through discovery pursuant to the Bankruptcy 26 Rules. 27

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VII. SEPARATE CONTESTED MATTERS

33. Each of the Claims and the Debtor's objections thereto constitute a separate contested
matter as contemplated by Bankruptcy Rules 3007 and 9014 and Local Rule 3007. The Debtor
requests that any order entered by the Court with respect to a particular Claim objected to in this
Omnibus Objection be deemed a separate order with respect to each Claim in accordance with
Bankruptcy Rule 3007(1).

7 **VIII. NOTICE**

8 34. The Debtor will serve copies of this Omnibus Objection upon each of the Claimants
9 identified in the chart contained herein at the addresses listed on the disputed Claims, as filed.

10 IX. CONCLUSION

The Debtor respectfully requests that the Court enter an order, substantially in the form
attached hereto as Exhibit 2 reducing certain claims and disallowing other Claims (and expunging
them from the Court's docket), and granting such other and further relief as the Court may deem
proper and just under the circumstances.
